Greater Omaha Iris Society (GOIS) wrapped up our year with a Thanksgiving potluck. We celebrated holding our first iris exhibition in nearly 7 years, adding the two missing Sass hybridized Siberian iris to our display garden, and welcoming several new members to the group. Sadly, we have also had to say goodbye to several old friends with the passing of Jan Fricke (September 3rd), Amy Green (November 19th), and Rich (December 5th) & Christa (December 15th) Kohout.

Jan, Amy, and Christa all had the distinction of serving as president at one time or another. Jan's beautiful garden was one of the tourstops featured during the 1990 AIS National convention where not only were the iris in great form but her peonies were exquisite as well. Jan was a talented artist and her mastery of color and light made her gardens a delight. Amy recruited many of her master gardener friends to GOIS and was a key organizer for the display gardens on the Sarpy County Fairgrounds in Springfield. Rich and Christa were bus captains during the 1990 convention, organizing tours that ranged from Plattsmouth to Lincoln, through Sioux City and as far north as Sioux Falls SD. Rich was one of the GOIS men who built our display garden sign and made all of the exhibition tubes that we still use at our shows. They were both judges (retired) and had a keen eye for iris quality. Even after they downsized their home and "eliminated" their gardens Rich managed to sneak in a few of his favorites including 'Dusky Challenger', 'Lily Pond', and 'Black Magic Woman'. Rich was also a lover of orchids and shared his cultivation tips for these plants freely with the group.

GOIS will start meeting again with the growing season, beginning in March, and will meet the second Saturday of the month at 11:00 AM. Mid-afternoon we will gather back at the hotel meeting room for regional announcements, a program, and the opening of the silent auction.



In Memoriam



Remembering Dean Douglas, August 4, 1933 - November 16, 2023

Dean Samuel Douglas, a longtime member of the Lincoln Iris Society, passed away on November 16, 2023. Dean is survived by his wife Judy, five children, 10 grandchildren and seven great grandchildren.

Dean Douglas was born on March 4, 1933 in Palmyra, Nebraska, grew up on a farm nearby and graduated from Palmyra High School. After attending Ag College at the University of Nebraska, Dean joined the U. S. Army and served from 1953-1955. He then worked for NC+ Hybrids for 39 years until he retired in 1998. Dean and Judy were married for 51 years. They moved to their two-acre spot in Elmwood in the fall of 1972. Dean had a passion for

irises, and that brought him and Judy to the Lincoln Iris Society more than two decades ago.

Dean began growing irises (65 of them) that he bought from Schliefert Iris Gardens near Murdock (after their first visit in 1990), but then the collection grew and grew and grew. He and Judy had a wonderful iris garden that was on local and regional tours several times. They were on both the 2004 TBIS/Region 21 and the 2007 MIS/Region 21 Tours which included hundreds of guest irises. They started a small business named Dean And Judy's Iris Patch, that brought lots of new friends to their iris garden. Dean hybridized a couple of irises, and registered them with the American Iris Society. Those two irises both are attached by name to the community he loved. They are 'Elmwood Sunset', a TB showing the colors of the sunset, and 'Bess Streeter Aldrich' a lovely yellow and white TB iris named for the author who made Elmwood her home. Both of those irises are growing in several of our gardens and in the Magdalene Pfister Iris Garden in the Maxwell Arboretum on the UNL east campus. Dean also maintained a full Dykes Medal collection at their home.

Irises, of course, connect and join the members of the Lincoln Iris Society, but it's the people who make our group so enjoyable and memorable. Dean embraced the Lincoln Iris Society and became very involved. He managed our annual iris rhizome sale for several years. He also managed our involvement in the Husker Lawn & Leisure Show for a number of years, and he was a past President of the Lincoln Iris Society during 2005 and 2006. Dean attended some of the Region 21 meetings as well as a few of the AIS

National conventions. Dean and Judy were given Honorable Life Membership in the group. It was great seeing Dean almost every month for the better part of 25 years....and enjoying his greetings, when he was always smiling, very upbeat, and welcoming. Dean was one of a kind, a great irisarian and a wonderful person. We miss you, dear friend.

Remembering Carolyn Lingenfelter, January 18, 1941 – October 4, 2023

On October 9, 2023 friends and family of Carolyn Lingenfelter gathered at St. Paul's church in Norfolk, Nebraska to remember and pay final respects to a fellow irisarian. In a fitting tribute, plants were shared with attendees, much as Carloyn had shared plants during her lifetime.

Carlyn was a life member of the American Iris Society and a fifty-year member of the Elkhorn Valley Iris Society where she served in all offices and as president. She also served as RVP of Region 21. Many kinds of iris graced her garden, with purple and lavender her favored colors.

Her plant interests extended far beyond iris as evidenced by her memberships in Master Gardeners, Norfolk Garden Club, Norfolk Tree Advisory Board, and as a charter member of Nebraska Daylily Society.

Carolyn's gardening pursuits included many hours spend caring for public plantings in her community. For many years, she maintained St. Paul's church landscaping. She was an active participant in care of plantings at Verges Park. It was through her efforts that the park was for public use and became the property of the Elkhorn Valley Museum.

She is survived by her husband, Gary, and her daughter, Trisha Kolterman.

Carolyn will be long missed and remembered by those of us who knew her.

Remembering David Lionberger, January 24, 1935 - November 1, 2023

David Lionberger, an honored member and past president of the Lincoln Iris Society, passed away peacefully on November 1, 2023 at Tabitha Journey House in Lincoln after an extended illness.

David was born on January 24, 1935 in Lincoln, attended Northeast High School, graduating in 1953. David met Marjorie Lou Kohl at Northeast High and after they both graduated in the same class, they were married the following February 7, 1954. David worked at a number of jobs, including for Pepsi-Cola and Goodyear Tire Company, and with his younger brother at George Lionberger Construction. Later, he was also a driver's license examiner for the Nebraska DMV.



Marjorie's favorite flower was the iris, and of course made David aware of that fact. Over the years, they visited local iris gardens including Allan Ensminger's garden, and later, Dean and Judy's Iris Patch. Those visits prompted Dave to plan and prepare an iris garden for Marjorie. Dave took care of the iris garden, enlarged it, and added many varieties to it. Eventually, he also started hybridizing, registering six tall bearded irises with the American Iris Society. The first two, 'Elderberry Wine' and 'Madeline Ruth' were registered and introduced in 2013, followed by 'Eli' in 2014. In 2017, David introduced two more, 'Blossoms Aflame' (from seed obtained from Bob Smith) and 'Lena Grace'. Three of his irises were named for Dave and Marjorie's great-grandchildren. And Dave's last registered iris was 'Marjorie Lou' in 2022 and named in honor of his wife of 69 years.

David and Marjorie joined the Lincoln Iris Society in June of 2009, quickly becoming involved in all the activities of the group. David, sometimes accompanied by one or two of his great-grandchildren, worked in the Magdalene Pfister Iris Garden on the East campus of UNL, helping maintain that garden for the iris society. In the fall of 2013, David was elected President of the Lincoln Iris Society, an office he held for six years, 2014 through 2019. In the fall of 2014, Dave also began writing and managing the LIS newsletter, the Rainbow Messenger, with help from Marjorie and his daughter, Melinda Smith. This arrangement with the newsletter continued through 2019. Also in 2019, David managed the annual iris rhizome sale for the club.

We miss Dave's stories and experiences, his practical outlook on life, and his humor and wit. Our thoughts and love go out to his family of 6 children and their families, including 10 grandchildren and 14 greatgrandchildren. David Lionberger's time in the Lincoln Iris Society had a lasting positive effect on this organization and we miss him dearly.
